Number of CofAs in London ER is growing while the number of active apprentices is dropping.

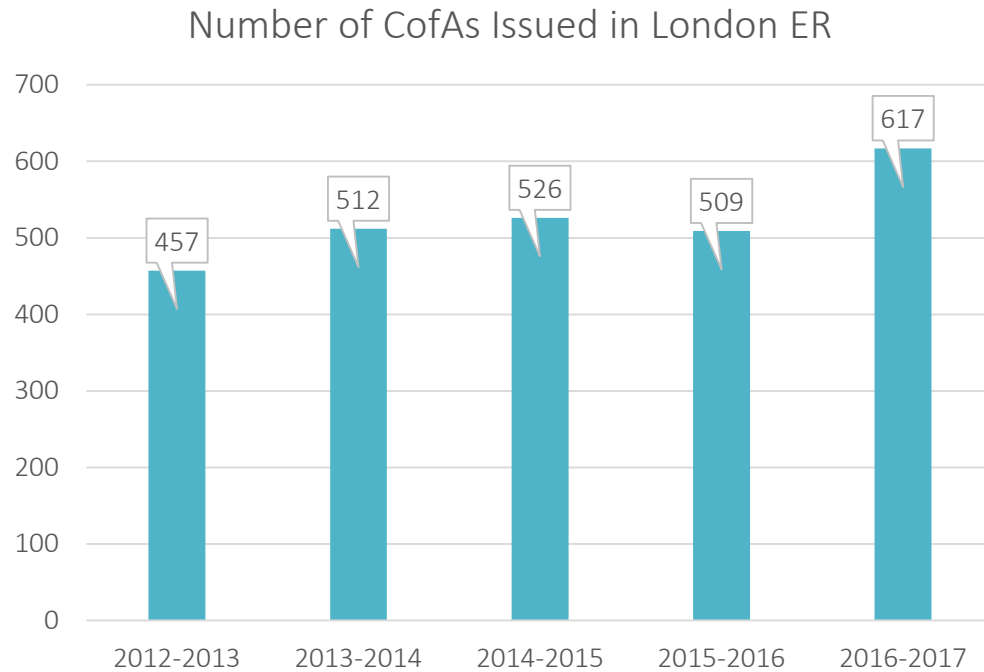

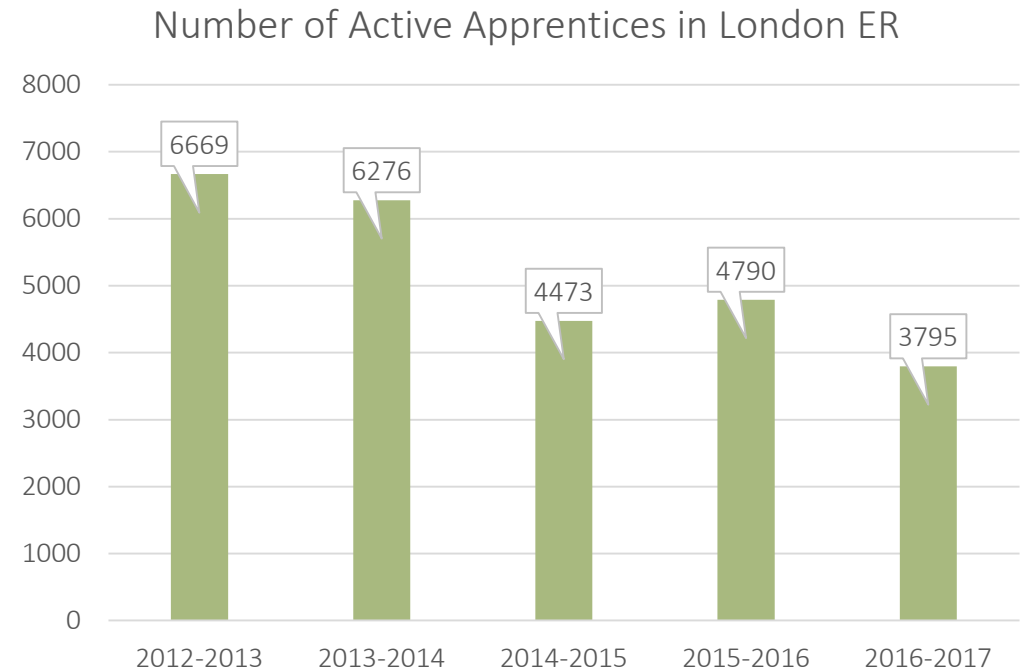

# Apprenticeship – New registrations

The increasing number of New Apprenticeship Registrations set since 2013/2014 was interrupted in 2016/2017 by a drop of 15%. The number of Modular Training Registrations maintained close to the 200 level in the past three fiscal years.

in London ER

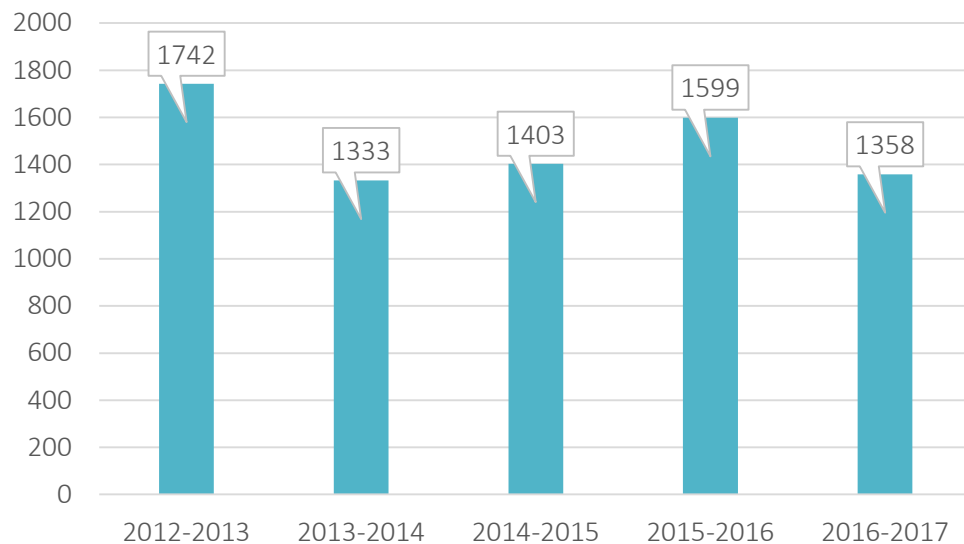

in London ER

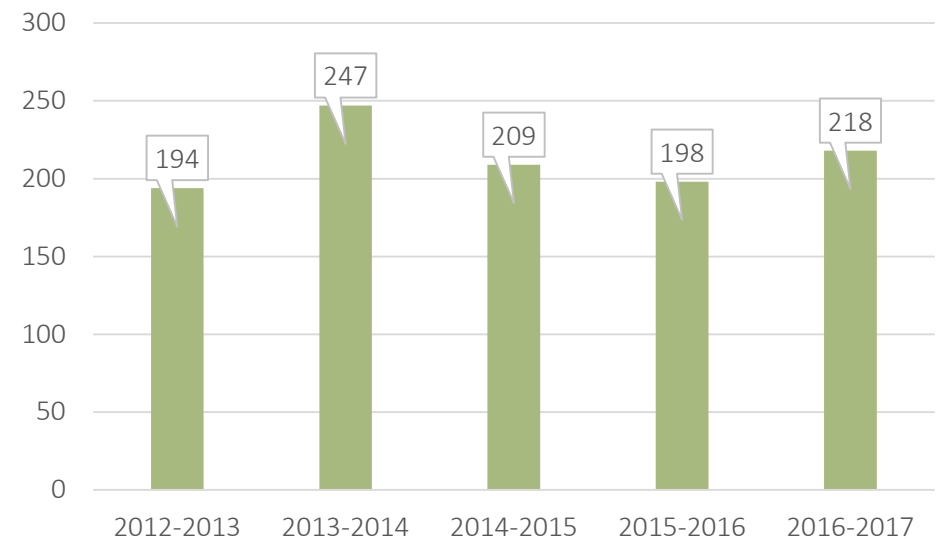

# Apprenticeship - Age

The largest Apprenticeship client age group was the 15-24 years old during 2016/2017 fiscal year. In London ER the Apprenticeship clients are more likely to be younger (15-24) than in Western Region or Ontario.

Apprenticeship Clients by Age during 2016/2017 in London ER

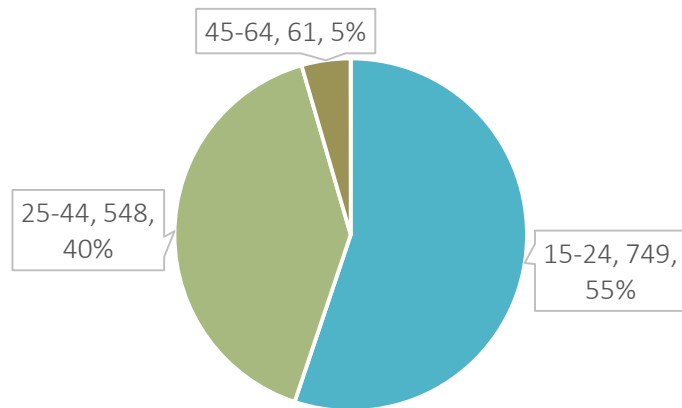

Apprenticeship clients during 2016/2017 by age group and location

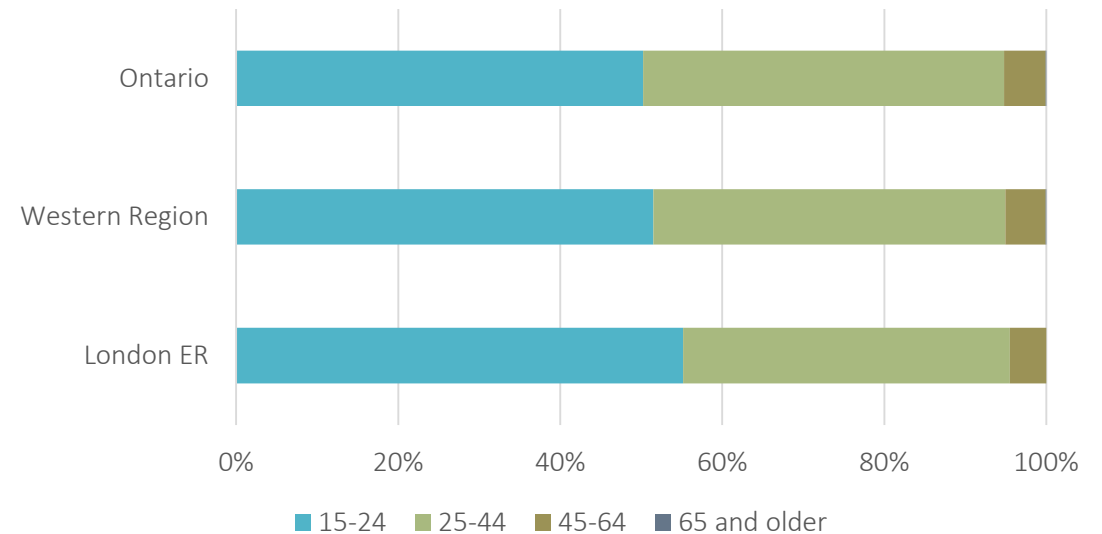

Apprenticeship clients in London ER during 2016/2017

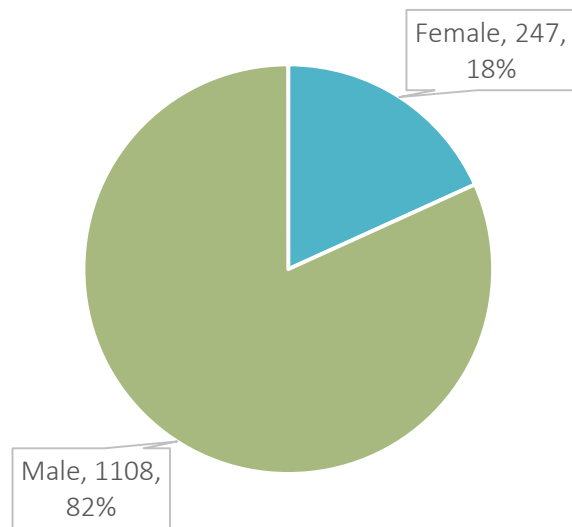

Apprenticeship clients during 2016/2017 by sex and location

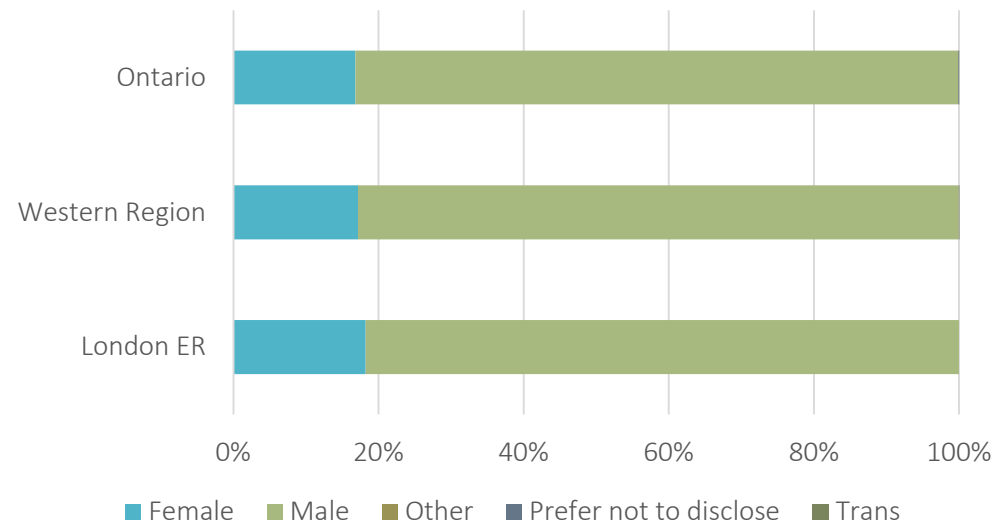

# Apprenticeship – Highest level of education at intake

During 2016/2017, the large majority of clients in London ER involved with the Apprenticeship program had “Completed Secondary School.” Further, the Apprenticeship clients in London ER were more likely to have a “Certificate/Diploma” or “Applied/Associate/Bachelor Degree” than clients in the Western Region or in Ontario.

Apprenticeship clients in London ER during 2016/2017 by the highest level of education at intake

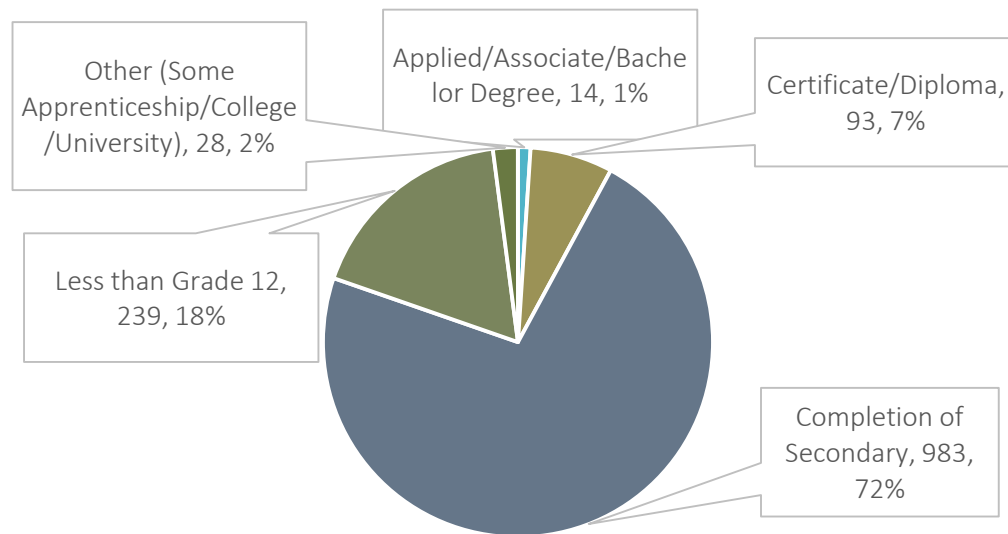

Apprenticeship clients during 2016/2017 by the highest level of education and location

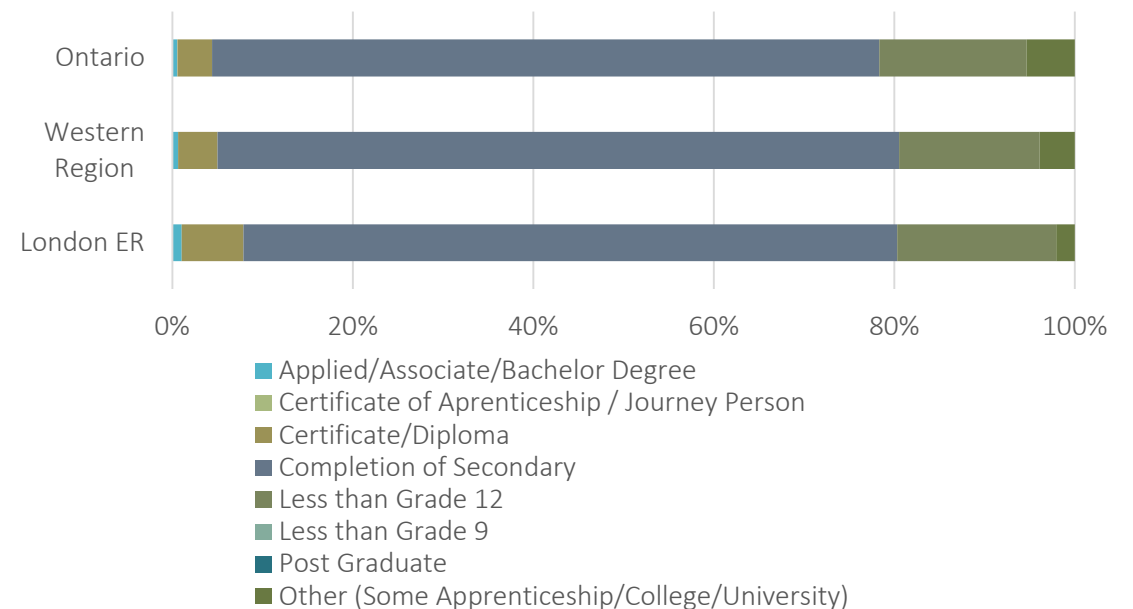
