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Clients by age

- During 2016/2017, 3 out of 4 clients of Youth Job Connection (YJC) in London Economic Region (ER) were between 15 and 24 years old while 1 out of 4 was between 24 and 44 years old. The YGC in London ER had a slightly larger proportion of clients of ages between 25 and 44 years old than the same program in the Western Region or Ontario.

YJC clients by age group - London ER, 2016/2017

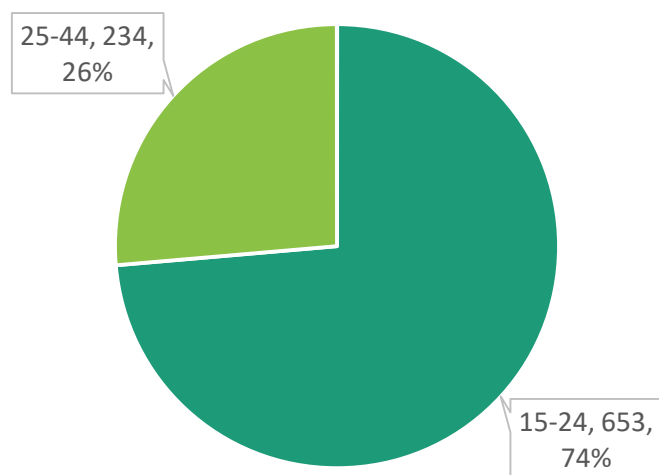

YJC clients by age group - 2016/2017

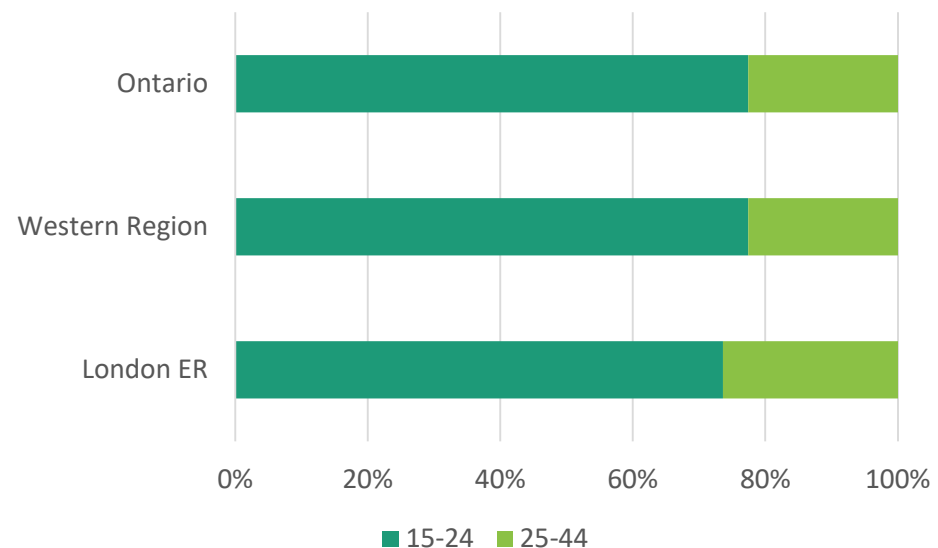

Clients by gender

- YJC clients in London ER were more likely to be males than females, 55% vs. 45% respectively. The proportion of female clients in London ER was slightly higher than in Western Region or Ontario.

2016/2017

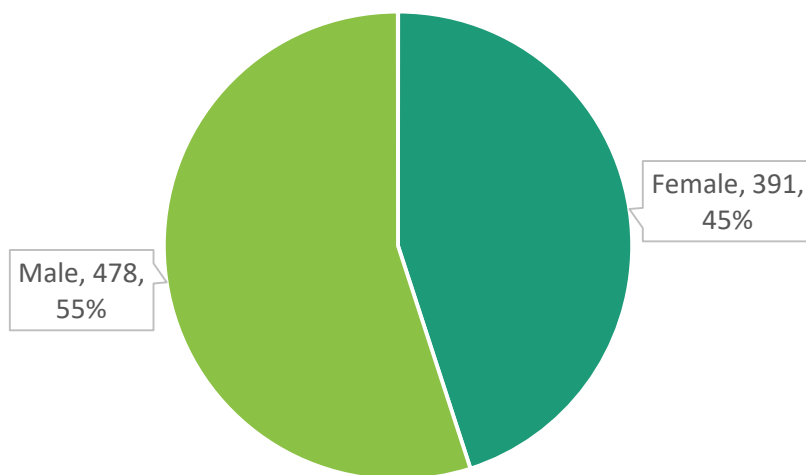

YJC clients by gender - 2016/2017

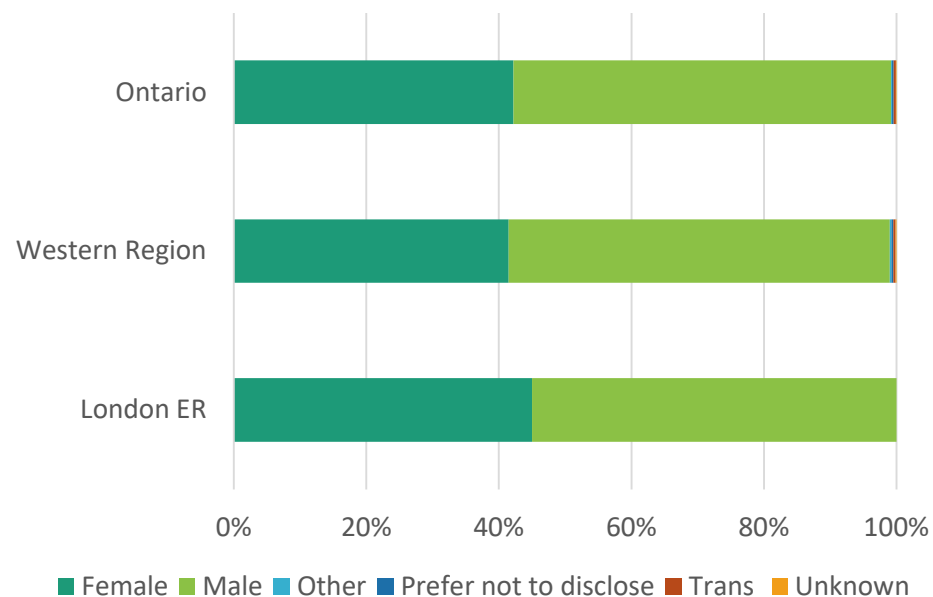

Clients by the highest level of education

- The largest groups of YJC in London ER were having “less than Grade 12” and “completed Secondary,” 39% and 43% respectively. Relative to the Western Region or the province, the YJC in London ER were more likely to have “less than Grade 12” education.

YJC clients by the highest level of education at intake - London ER, 2016/2017

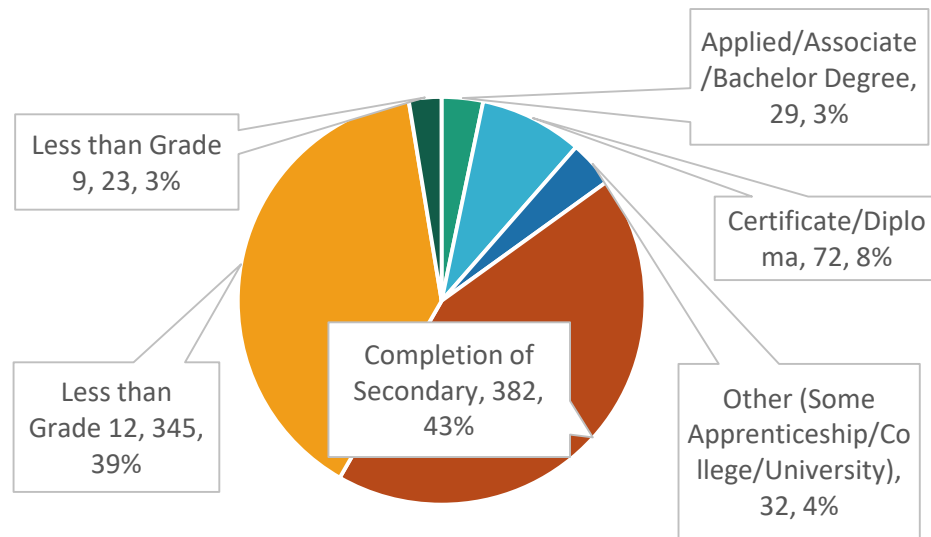

YJC clients by the highest level of education at intake - London ER, 2016/2017

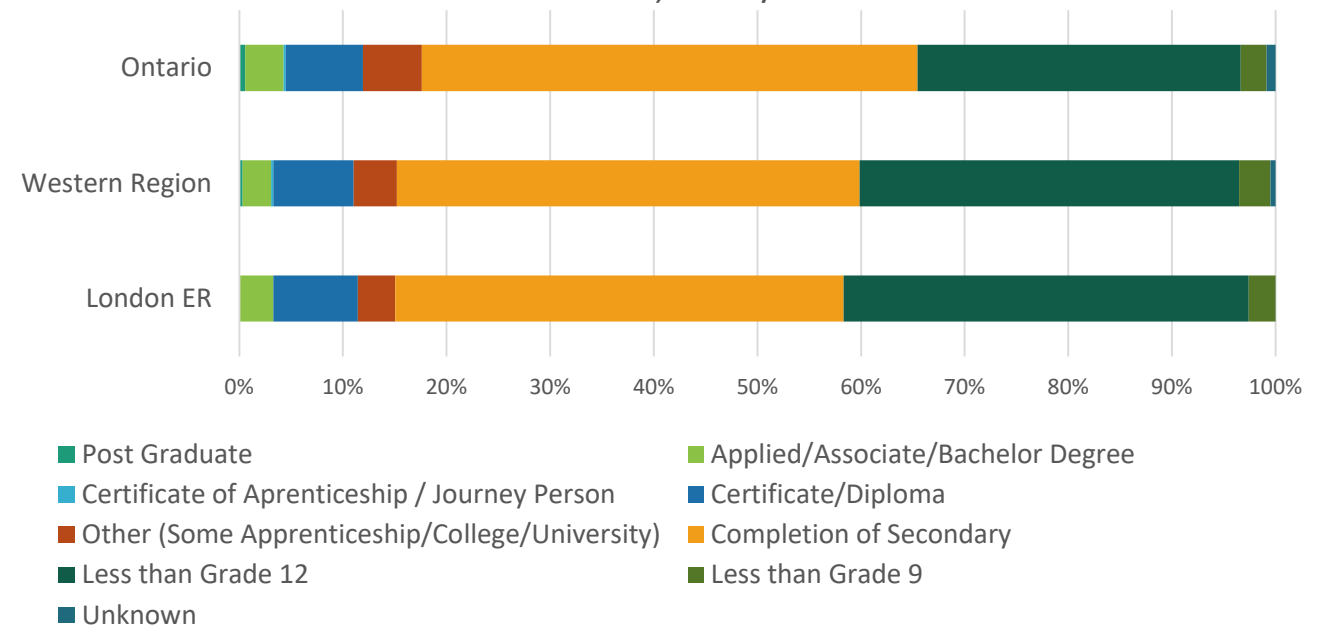

Clients by association to a designated group

- In London ER, the largest group of YJC clients associated to a designated group was “persons with disability,” 57% respectively. Considering all the designated groups, relative to Western Region or Ontario, YJC clients in London ER were more likely to be “persons with disabilities” or “Aboriginals.”

YJC clients by designated groups - London ER, 2016/2017

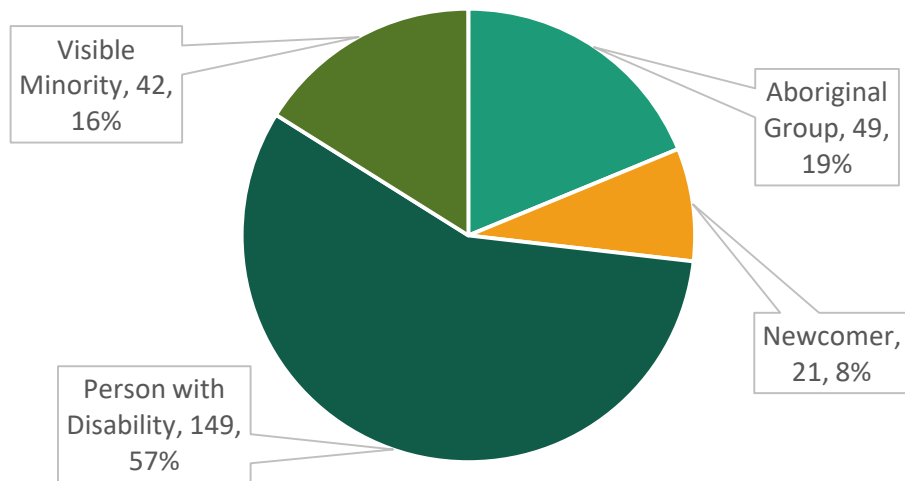

YJC clients by designated groups - London ER, 2016/2017

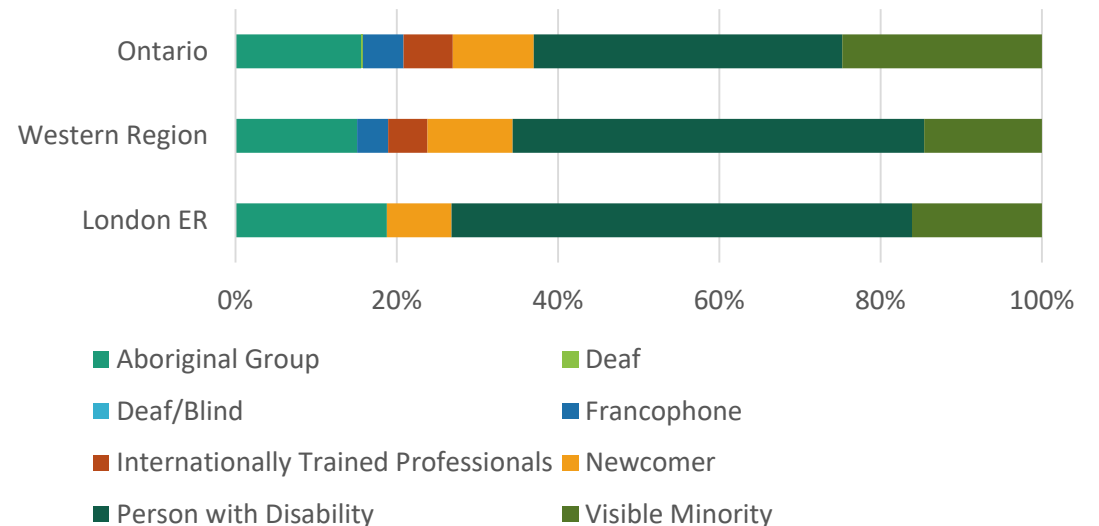

Clients by association to a designated group

- In London ER, a smaller proportion of the YJC clients were associated to designated groups than in Western Region or Ontario

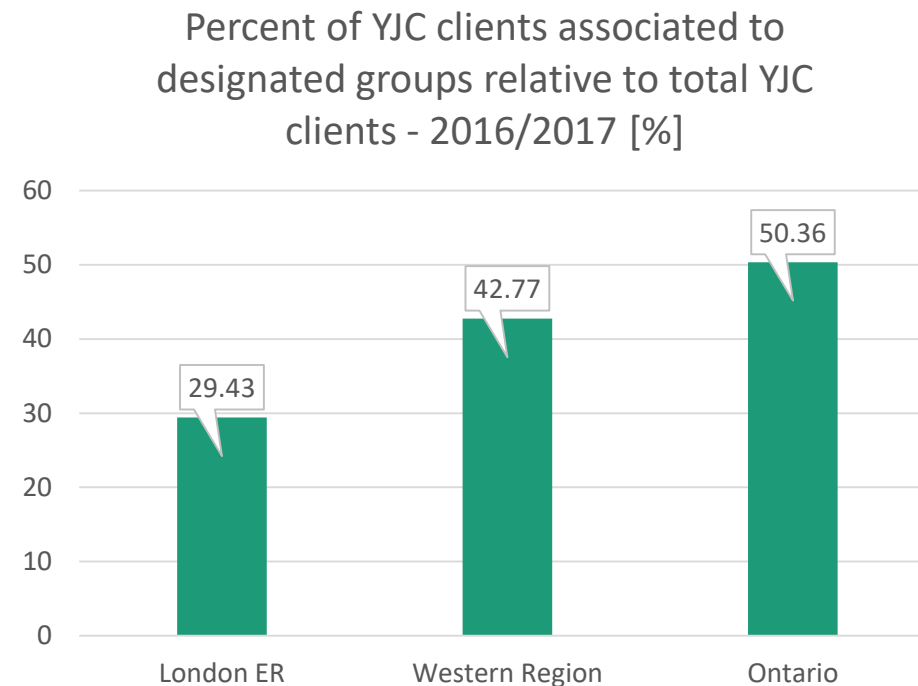

Clients by source of income

- In London ER, the largest groups of YJC clients by source of income were associated to “Ontario Works” and “no source of income,” 43% and 34% respectively. However, relative to Western Region and Ontario YJC clients, the London ER clients were more likely to be associated to “Ontario Works” and less likely to report “no source of income.”

YJC clients by the source of income - London ER, 2016/2017

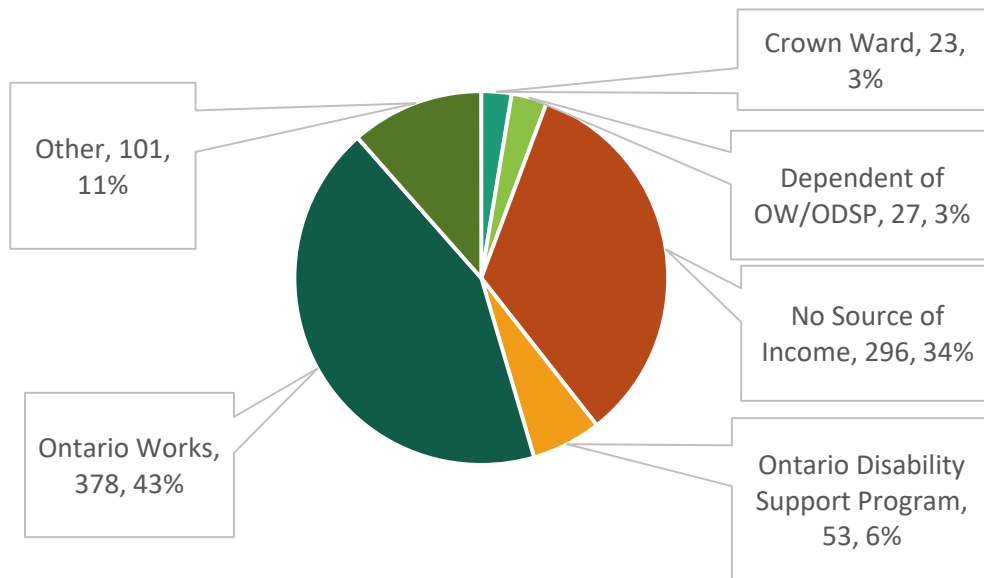

YJC clients by the source of income - 2016/2017

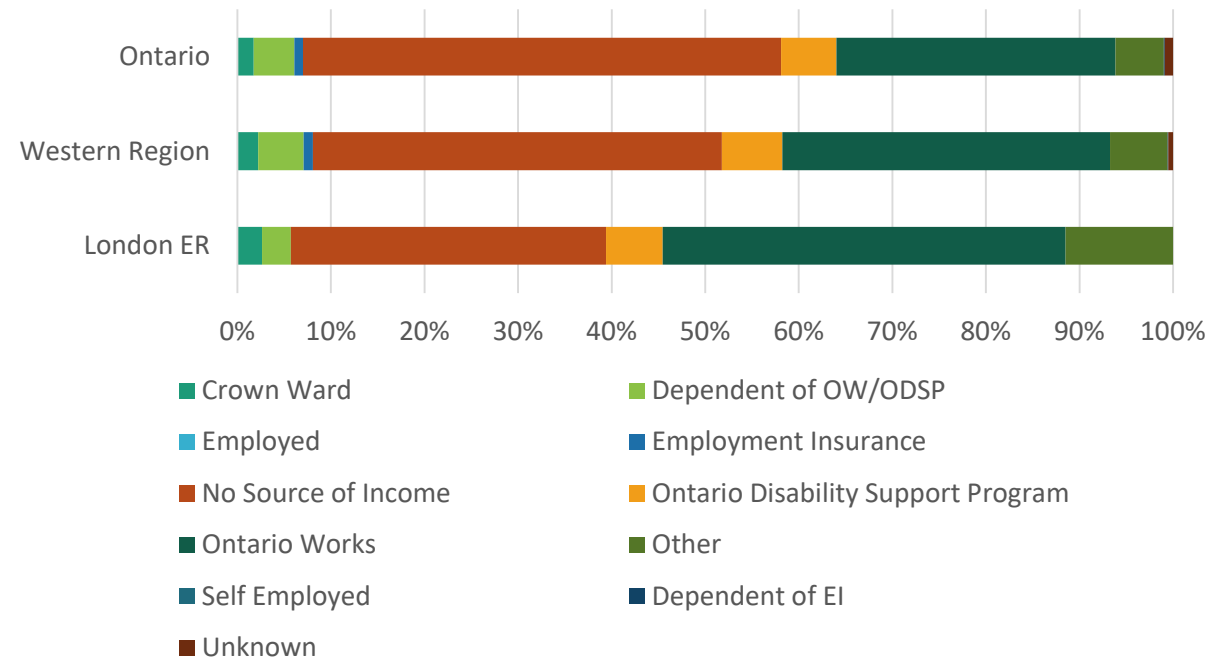
